

This collabrative philanthropy between UVa and Virginia Tech Phi Gams has brought our chapters closer together and helped us to combine resources, creating a truly stellar event. As a result, The Run has raised over \$100,000 for the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research with donations from businesses, family, and friends. The Jimmy V Foundation has been so impressed by our efforts that they named a \$100,000 research grant in the Fraternity's name last year.



The chapters has collected over \$32428 this year, and money is still arriving. Business participation in the Run is at an all-time high and our annual a cappella benefit concert, *Fiji's Sing For a Cure*, brought in an additional \$800. 
