Jared Cooper ('03) finished his masters of public health in summer of 2008 at USUHS. Now working in Neurosurgery Research at Northern Mem. Hospital.



C. James Jessee Jr. '49, Archon President from 1986 to 1988, passed ad astra on June 14, 2009. Brother Jessee graduated from Naval Flight School and was commissioned an aviator in the Marine Corps during WWII.

After graduation from UVA, he was called into active duty again as a command helicopter pilot in the Korean War. Law school at

He served as Legate for the rechartering of the Omicron Chapter in February 2004 and faithfully attended 19 Ekklesiai and 13 Fiji Golf Classics. He received the Distinguished Fiji Service Award in 1980 and again in 1988, and he was named a Distinguished Fiji in 1990.


