### LETTER FROM THE FRATERNITY ALUMNI COUNCIL

We, the members of the Fraternity Alumni Council (FAC), are writing to you, a University of Virginia fraternity alumnus, about the events surrounding the Rolling Stone article published in late 2014 that was fully discredited and now proven to be completely fabricated. This article thrust the University fraternity system into turmoil, and we have the opportunity to briefly reflect on the ramifications of this event, and more importantly, to focus on the future of the Greek system at UVA.

During that tumultuous two week period last fall, the University was in the middle of a firestorm of events that seemed completely unfathomable. Our 165 year old Greek system, and our University, was maligned and attacked from all sides. We were vilified in the national press, subjected to verbal and physical attacks from reactionary protesters, and smeared by members of our own University community, long before the facts came out. It should be noted that our young fraternity men acted with class and dignity at every opportunity. Our Greek system's integrity was maintained, and our brothers fully embraced the challenges presented, making our fraternity system a stronger and safer place for all.

As fraternity alumni, we may question the motives and actions of the University administration during this crisis, as well as the reactions from members of our own faculty. However, we all should recognize that events unfolded in a spiraling manner, the veracity of the story itself had not been refuted, and it was virtually impossible for everyone to keep up with the unfolding events and keep everyone informed. We stayed on top of the dialogue between the University and our fraternity men, providing counseling and advice as best we could in light of the unprecedented circumstances. We have concluded that the IFC made changes that were appropriate to strengthen and preserve our Greek system. The administration did their best to make sure that the student's interests were protected in the short and long term. Associate Vice President and University Dean of Students Allen Groves, who is the former International President of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, was in constant communication with Phi Psi and the IFC, as he tried to mitigate the fallout and keep our students from harm. Certainly 'hindsight is 20/20' and all parties agree that some of the decisions made at the time could have been handled differently. However, the end result is that communication between the administration, students and alumni is stronger as a result.

Our fraternity men continue to excel. In the classroom, fraternity men posted a higher average GPA than the all-male average at the University. Funds raised by fraternities that went to charity totaled \$127,000 in the last 12 months, and IFC members completed over 18,000 community service hours this past year. Rush numbers in 2015 were the highest ever with over 1000 diverse, young men looking to join a fraternity. The IFC continues to field inquiries from new fraternal organizations that view UVA as a desirable place to start a new chapter. There is no doubt our men are leaders at all levels of the University , including a fraternity man from Beta Theta Pi who was just named the only Rhodes Scholar from the University this academic year.

As your alumni representatives, we firmly believe that we need to work together, not only to help ensure the strength of our own chapters, but of the fraternity system as a whole. We cannot dwell on the mistakes of the past, but we must focus on the enhancement and preservation of UVA's outstanding fraternity system. We need to support our young men so that they can have the positive experiences we enjoyed during our time at the University. We need to support the University and its Jeffersonian system of student self-governance that allows our fraternities to thrive in a changing environment. Our FAC is in constant contact with the IFC Governing Board, the Alumni Association, and has established a more direct line of communication with the President's office. We invite you to consider joining our Board so we can have broad representation of all fraternities, but also reach out to your own chapter, as alumni support has proven to foster a stronger presence at the University. Our overall support and continuing involvement with the University will allow us to positively impact future challenges that we will face. Our Greek system has remained consistent and relevant over the years as our members have evolved and grown. Take this opportunity to join us in supporting the Greek system and the University that we all love. Support our fraternity men and help us support and showcase the character and resolve our young men possess.


