STATE OF 128 MADISON LANE

This past summer, I wrote about the challenges of maintaining 128 Madison Ln. and the long list of projects we were undertaking as House Corporation. Well, thanks to the continued support of our graduates and the ongoing strength of the chapter, I am proud to report that we were able to complete all of the high priority projects on our facilities plan.

As we start a new term and begin working with a new undergraduate exec, our focus again turns to the future. This summer will be a transition year, with our focus being minor repairs and saving for the next year.

In coordination with the Chapter, we are making some significant changes to the way we lease our rooms. First, we are changing from monthly to semesterly payments for rent. Second, we are joining the Chapter in using Legacy Financial to enable online payment and tracking. Third, we are planning to go from 12 month to 10 month leases the summer of 2019, in a move that will allow us to close the house in the summer.

We are currently the only house that remains open for the summer. It not only prevents us from doing comprehensive maintenance and repairs, it is also disproportionally expensive to keep the house running during the summer. The house takes a significant beating during the summer, with no house manager in charge of minor repairs, cleanups, etc.

Our plan is to raise funds between now and the summer of 2019 that will allow us to significantly "restore" the bedrooms and common areas of the house during the summer months. While a complete survey hasn't been done yet, this could include refinishing floors, plaster/painting, window repair, etc. Many of the bedrooms have not been fully emptied in over 15 years, preventing us from fully investigating the condition of the rooms and lofts.

Lastly, this move will allow us to refocus the chapter's fall work days on actually improving the house – and not just cleaning all the trash out from the summer's tenants.

One consequence of this decision, however, is that the Chapter House will potentially be closed during summer Reunions. We are still working through the details and whether there is an option to open for a limited basis to allow grads back into the Chapter House. But we hope that the end result will be a cleaner, stronger 128, that you are proud to bring your families back to.
